# **1.1 INTRODUCTION**

Veerangana awanti bai lodhi government college patharia, dist mungeli (Chhattisgarh) was established in 1989 by the Department of higher education, Chhattisgarh government, Raipur with a well-defined motive of "rural youth empowerment through quality education in science, arts, and commerce." The neighborhood villages and community of patharia naturally felt the need of the college to impart higher education to the coming generation and establishment their dream into reality.

The college is a guild of learners united together. Here the thought is free from all fetters and all sources of knowledge and all learning aids are accessible to all comers without distinction of caste, color or creed, riches or poverty.

Intellectual development forms the chief feature of the college. It expands the minds of students, opens their hearts, kindles sentiment, and rouses high hopes and noble aspirations. The courses of study are varied and comprehensive. They suit all tests and temperaments. one can read subjects of one's choice without any compulsion. Ample opportunities are provided for instructions in Hindi Literature, Economics, Political science, History, Sociology, Chemistry, Botany and Zoology, Commerce, and various arts and craft. # **1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY**

## **Curricular Aspects**

Veerangna Awanti Bai Lodhi Govt. College, Pathriya dist.- Mungeli Chhattisgarh, was established on 12 July 1989. Later the 14.69 acres of land were donated by Late Shri Maya Ram Verma in 2003 It offers UG Courses in all three streams, Science, Arts, and commerce. UG (Arts) included Hindi, English, Economics, Geography, Sociology, and Political Science; UG (Science) only Bio-group, Biology, zoology, and chemistry and UG (commerce) streams as for the University curriculum.

Now it has blossomed into a renowned institution for higher education reaching the poor and backward rural people with the mission to impart higher education to them with ethical, moral, and physical upliftment. It also intends to train young men and women to become good citizens of the country and develop the necessary competencies and skills required for being successful in life.

The college is affiliated with Bilaspur University, Bilaspur follows the curriculum designed and decided by the university. To keep the curriculum updated and relevant to the needs of society, periodic revisions are made to the curriculum of the different subjects by the University. Some faculty members of the instruction are either the chairperson or members of the Central Board of studies of the University and are involved in the revision of the curriculum. English language and Hindi, both called foundation courses, and environmental science are mandatory subjects at the U.G. level and all other subject combinations are as per the guidelines of the University. Students need to perceive and discharge their responsibility towards it. The college has an active unit of NSS and Youth Reds Cross.

Since the college is located in an economically and socially underprivileged region, the college gives preference admission to marginalized groups such as SC, ST, OBC, and female candidates as per the norms of the government of Chhattisgarh.

There is a feedback mechanism in which suggestions are welcomed by student parents, alumni, etc., and are incorporated to make the teaching-learning process more effective.

## **Teaching-learning and Evaluation**

The process of admitting students to programs is quite transparent. Students are admitted based on their marks in the last qualifying exam. i.e., on a merit basis. However, the college strictly follows the guideline laid down by the Government of Chhattisgarh in the matter of reservation to SC/ST/OBC/physically challenged/Women/Sports Quota. The college offers a well-organized system for the all-round development of students coming from diverse fields and localities.

For a well-rounded development of the students, the college offers a proper blend of academics and sports. Advanced learners are motivated and encouraged to achieve higher goals and shoulder important responsibilities of society. The college is sensitive to the needs of disadvantaged students for whom counseling and special classes are also arranged.

The academic progress of students is carefully and continuously monitored. Emphasis is given to assignments and continuous internal evaluation. The college gives much emphasis on the attendance of students. The teacher is encouraged to make use of innovative teaching-learning practices along with traditional methods and the majority of the teachers use student-centric practices in their classrooms.

The college has an Internal Quality assurance Cell (IQAC) that meets periodically to discuss various issues regarding teaching-learning and evaluation processes.

The college has presently a total of eleven regular faculty members, of which seven are male and four female. Five, have Ph. D. degrees. Two faculty members are currently registered for their Ph. D All the faculty members have participated/presented papers in various nation national/international seminars, conferences, and workshops. Most of the faculty members have completed their Orientation/Refresher courses. The newly recruited assistant professors are refresher courses for career enhancement.

The college follows an academic calendar decided by the Department of Higher Education, Government of Chhattisgarh. It has a schedule for teaching/examination/vacation etc. The traditional method of teaching i.e. use of chalk-duster is mostly used by the faculty members for teaching.

The institution follows the traditional method of evaluation of students. Examination schedule/ pattern/evaluation of answer sheet and declaration of result etc. all are framed and decided by the University.

## **Research, Innovations and Extension**

The institution is recognized as a research center, Four faculty member are registered as research supervisors of the affiliating University or other university and carry out research independently some student is pursuing their ph. D. under their supervision at other research centers.

Research papers have been published in national and international journals by a faculty member. chapter in various books for U.G. students has also been published by the faculty member.

The institution encourages its faculty member to utilize their expertise for taking up consultancy services. The extension activities of the college are managed and supervised by the dedicated faculty member as coordinators of NSS and Youth Red Cross and there is enthusiastic participation of the student in all such activities. Red Cross is established in the college and has organized vision activities. Student volunteers of NSS have

organized sapling plantation programs, AIDS awareness programs, street plays to highlight social evils, and many other programs of social relevance, sanitation, and hygiene, cleaning and construction of drains, etc. Student volunteers of YRC are also actively involved in various activities like health check-up camps, Blood donation camps, and lectures on Sickle cell disease, under the Desis of college patharia. Plantation in college premises and many other awareness programs. Rallies on different occasions are organized and days of national importance are celebrated by the student of NSS and Sports with great enthusiasm.

### **Infrastructure and Learning Resources**

The college has a large campus of an area of 14.69 acres with a big playground. The whole campus is fully not protected by a boundary wall. It has an almost adequate number of classrooms and laboratories. it has Indraprastha stadium on the college premise. It has 16 classrooms, and four laboratories located still to keep pace with academic advancement and a growing number of students, more classrooms and laboratories are required to be constructed and existing laboratories are required to provide advanced amenities. As per the govt. guidelines the SC,& ST – boys and girls of college reside at the post-matric hostel, patharia dist. Mungeli (C.G.). there are other facilities such as the availability of refrigerated drinking water and a washroom for a student. The college has a placement and counseling cell also.

The library has an almost sufficient infrastructure to cater to the needs of students and faculty members. It has a total book in the various subject at UG and PG levels about 10000. For all academic activities, the college has a Department of Geography for better and more effective teaching. To the department of Geography subject. The college being a government organization, the maintenance and upkeep of the infrastructure are done by the public works department at the request of the college.

### **Student Support and Progression**

The college is committed to providing the best infrastructure and academic facilities to all its student with whatever resources the college has. The result is at par with another college of the University. The college-published prospectus provides entire information like a brief history of the college, college rules, seats available in different programs, eligibility criteria, admission rules, etc. to the student seeking admission to the students. Keeping in view, the vision of the college, which has to contribute significantly to the development of the state, the college provided financial assistance in the form of scholarships, fee concession, and stationery items and also assistance in the form of remedial and special classes to the needy students. Socially and economically weaker students are provided reservations as per the norms of the Government of Chhattisgarh. The college also has a career guidance and placement cell which has helped students to get employment in nearby industries.

Students are actively involved in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities also. The institution organizes various intra-college and inter-college sports competitions and many students have won accolades at University and State level competitions. The NNS and YRC students are very active in discharging their social responsibilities and performing various community services. Annual cultural programs are also celebrated by the student with great enthusiasm. Students who excel in academic cultural and other co-curricular, extra-curricular

activities are awarded certificates and prizes.

### **Governance, Leadership and Management**

The vision of the college is to equip students with all desired qualities to make them civilized and responsible citizens of India and serve the nation to make it. Veerangana Awanti Bai Lodhi Government College Patharia is affiliated with Atal Bihari Vajpai University, Bilaspur (C.G). The University constitutes the Board of Studies (BOS) for making the curriculum of each subject. The teaching faculties of different subjects of different colleges affiliated with the university are made members of the BOS. Thus, the Board of Studies makes the curricula of all subjects and these curricula are followed and implemented by the college. After three years the curriculum of each subject is revised. The curricula are framed as per the needs of society, changing circumstances, the development of science and information technology, and job opportunities for students. The college ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well-planned and documented process. The college develops and deploys action plans for effective implementation of the curriculum at the beginning of the session. The faculties of each subject divide the syllabus into several units, explain the divided syllabus in detail, get familiar with difficulties and provide solutions to students. After completing the syllabus unit wise the teachers conduct unit tests and evaluate the performance of students. Workshops on revised curriculum: many staff attended workshops on the revised curriculum. In workshops, contents, daft, and relevance of the curriculum have been discussed. It helps the faculty to deliver the curriculum effectively.

## Academic Calendar:

At the beginning of the academic session, the Office of the Commissioner, of Higher Education, Chhattisgarh Govt. sends a proposed academic calendar for each session. The college follows the academic calendar sincerely. As per the academic calendar, each department prepares its own academic calendar. The college academic calendar is prepared on the basis of the department calendar of all departments and various committees. The final draft is placed in the IQAC meeting at the end of the previous academic year for discussion and to incorporate additional inputs if any. Academic dairy is the heart of our teaching-learning process and a single point of academic evaluation. Every staff member prepares a lecture note one day in advance of their lecture to be engaged. In the lecture note, faculty members mention the points to be covered, and methods of teaching to be used. The syllabus is distributed among the faculties according to their interest and teaching experience in the department meetings. It helps to execute our timetable.

## Monitoring the teaching-learning process:

The implementation of the teaching plan and lecture notes are supervised regularly by the head of the department. Every month the head of the department informally discusses with the principal the progress of teaching and learning. Teaching plans and lecture notes are made available in the respective departments. The college conducts unit tests, sessional tests, and pre-final examinations for the appropriate evaluation of students. the process is fruitful to improve the quality of teaching and learning. The IQAC regularly monitors the overall teaching and learning process by collecting the students' feedback. The college conducts academic and administrative audits every year.

**Problem-solving method-** While teaching in the class, students participate in the learning process and experience those things in their practical, fieldwork, and industry visits. Evaluation is an integral part of the teaching-learning process. With regular interaction of IQAC and heads of the department, the examination committee plans and works out reforms in the evaluation system. The college adjusts the academic calendar by including internal assessments and the university examination. The institutional internal evaluation system is decentralized in order to make it more transparent and objective.

Apart from university-prescribed methods like assignments and tutorials, more relevant methods such as open book tests, surprise tests, multiple choice questions, mid-term examinations, peer evaluations, project work, internships, etc. experiment in the internal assessment. The departments of Commerce, Sociology, Hindi, Political Science, Botany Zoology, and Chemistry also assess the learning levels of the students by assigning them some project work and internships.

Unit tests are conducted periodically. Sessional tests and pre-final examinations are arranged before university examinations. The assessment work is carried out by the concerned subject

faculty in the institution. The evaluation reports are prepared within the stipulated time and communicated to the

students in the classroom as well as displayed on the notice board. The answer books are shown on the demand of the students and the students are guided for their better performance in the forthcoming examination of the university. Question papers for all tests and assignments are linked with course outcomes (COs). Results are declared within a week from the end of the exam. Compiled marks are displayed and communicated to the students. A ledger of valuation is prepared and kept for the student to know their progress.
